

EcoHood | Building a Better L.A.

Through the vision and leadership of Criminal Justice Fellows, Pete White and Mike De La Rocha, a new project called EcoHood looks to build a better Los Angeles, with a sustainable and innovative approach to combating homelessness.

Los Angeles' homeless population increased by 14% over the last year, with tents and makeshift dwellings covering sidewalks. Billions in government funds have been allocated towards costly, inefficient public-private partnership housing deals that take years to complete.

From Pete and Mike's perspective, "Housing is not a commodity. Housing is a human right. It is a public good," and the city needs a new alternative that utilizes the government's vast inventory of vacant or underutilized public and private properties.

The EcoHood development is creating a template for a new housing paradigm.

Combining prefabricated, modular-built small-footprint residences with solar power and other energy performance features, LA CAN's EcoHood pilot project will feature twelve 275 to 325 square foot fully-equipped 1BR and 2BR units. This complex will include an organic gardening space, fostering a relaxing sense of community, and enabling residents to pursue educational and employment opportunities.

According to Pete, what makes the EcoHood model unique is a faster, more affordable solution, with an average price per unit of \$85,000; a more dignified home design, in contrast to the



tiny home, pallet shelters projects designed for disaster relief; and a longer term solution, filling the gap between temporary housing solutions and permanent supportive housing.

Adding to the efficiencies, the EcoHood neighborhood will be located on donated land and will not rely on public resources, with funding for the innovative \$4 million project coming from individual and foundation giving and events.

Unite America Believes Democracy is Advanced When the Majority Voice is Preserved



A spoiler candidate pulls votes away from an otherwise popular candidate, and the opposing candidate, with less than 50% support, wins the election and advances positions that don't represent the majority voice of their constituency.

That scenario has not been uncommon, and it's just one of the issues that Summit Impact Democracy Fellow, Nick Troiano, is seeking to address as the Executive Director of Unite America.

Following a notable run for Congress as a young independent candidate in south central Pennsylvania in 2014, Nick worked for Change.org on Change Politics – a non-partisan platform that empowers citizens to make informed decisions on Election Day. In 2016, he became the Executive Director of Unite America and was named to the "Forbes 30 Under 30" for Law & Policy.

Unite America is a movement of Democrats, Republicans, and independents working to bridge the growing partisan divide and foster a more representative and functional government.


Among Unite America's approaches is advocacy for "ranked choice voting,"

allowing voters to choose multiple candidates in order of preference. If a voters candidate fails to make it past the first round, their second place vote is counted instead, until one candidate receives a majority vote. Now in place in both Maine and Alaska, ranking choice voting had a significant impact on this year's Alaska congressional election.

According to Unite America, ranked choice voting advances democracy in four ways: guaranteeing a majority winner; increasing competition by eliminating the "spoiler effect" argument for non-establishment, third party, and independent candidates; saving taxpayer money by creating an automatic run-off election when the leading candidate earns less than 50% of the vote; and encouraging civility as candidates need to appeal to their opponent's supporters for second place votes.

Other Unite America strategies include independent redistricting, nonpartisan primaries, and voting at home.

"If we want our great American experiment of self-government...to



endure, we're going to need to make some serious changes to our politics." And that's exactly the effort that Nick, and Unite America, are determined to lead.

Engaging Voters and Infusing Love

Two Change-makers Creating an Equitable Future

Working in the San Francisco Bay Area and Washington DC, two change-makers, both Summit Impact Fellows, are harnessing the power of community to create an equitable future.

For Summit Impact Criminal Justice Fellow, Cristine Soto DeBerry, it was her own brief experience with jail that inspired her journey. Arrested and taken to county jail while participating in a student sit-in at UCLA, she discovered that her conceptions about the people in jail were, in reality, misconceptions. Instead of feeling threatened, she and her fellow classmates were cheered on by the other women prisoners.

Two change-makers, both Summit Impact Fellows, are harnessing the power of community to create an equitable future.

Cristine would become a lawyer; and it was that experience at UCLA that led Cristine to take her own look at the criminal justice system.

She started as a public defender. repeatedly telling prosecutors "Jail isn't going to fix this problem," and then became a prosecutor herself, bringing past experiences and stories with her. With a vision to infuse her belief that "love is a much better solution to problems than fear" across the criminal justice field, Cristine founded the Prosecutors Alliance of California, for which she serves as Executive Director.

This year alone, Prosecutors Alliance has successfully championed four pieces of landmark legislation, protecting the DNA of sexual assault survivors, enhancing transparency of district attorney offices, addressing the punitive use of driver license suspensions, and combatting retail theft through proactive approaches. They have published a comprehensive research survey on the needs of crime survivors and designed innovative trainings delivered to prosecutors, victim advocates, and community-based organizations.

From Cristine's perspective, her change-making efforts are centered on "infusing love into the work." Not accepting criminal justice as a zero

instead complement one another."

Early in her professional career, she was sparked by how she could harness the power of the internet to build connections and affect change and how her Facebook and Twitter skills could actually be a job. While working at ACRONYM, a nonprofit organization committed to building power and digital infrastructure for the progressive movement, she built a \$12.5M program to expand the electorate, working to reach, register, and mobilize Black and Latina voters across eight states in the 2020 general election and the Georgia Senate runoff elections. engaging over 200,000 new and infrequent voters.

Wanting to change the paradigm for how marketing engages people of color around voting, Tatenda created the Voter Formation Project, for

which she serves as Founder and CEO, with the intention of increasing participation in local, state, and national elections through digital communications, experimentation, and knowledge sharing.

As a change-maker, Tatenda measures her impact not only by the world that she builds outside her office but, just as importantly, by the culture she builds inside her organization. In year two, with a staff of fifteen, Tatenda says that vision of a staff culture focused on equity, inclusiveness, and well-being has been unaltered.

For Tatenda. Voter Formation Project being a leader in the field isn't defined by leaving other aligned organizations far behind in its wake. Instead, success means leading the field itself to success. Pushing the practitioners in the space to succeed is, in her mind, a huge win.

Across the county, and indeed across the world. Summit Impact Fellows such as Cristine and Tatenda are making a world of difference, engaging voters and infusing love.

Weather Report: Changing Climate Presents an Equity Opportunity

Adapted from Eric Berlow, Ecologist, Data Scientist, Summit Impact Advisor, and creator of the Climate Map

The Case for Climate Equity & Resilience:

Nearly every corner of the world is feeling the impact of increased drought, wildfires, flooding and extreme weather due to climate change. Central to global climate adaptation efforts is ensuring that the most vulnerable populations of climate vulnerable regions have equitable secure access to food, water, energy, and housing so

that they can survive and thrive in the face of climatic stressors.

Overcoming inequities in the capacity of the most vulnerable communities to meet their basic needs - and thrive - in the face of climate-induced changes to their environment is, by definition, at the root of global climate adaptation and resilience. Any investments in equity which enable secure access to food, water, and other core human needs directly increases global climate resilience.

Many parts of the world where people now live will become uninhabitable by humans due to climate change. Even more parts of the world will remain habitable but with difficulty. These are our 'Resilience Opportunity Zones'. Increasing the resilience of these vulnerable communities globally helps reduce secondary climate crises elsewhere due to mass migration.

Central to climate mitigation is reducing current emissions. Gross inequity in wealth means only a tiny fraction of the population can currently afford the most innovative emissions reduction solutions. From renewable energy to electric mobility to climatesmart everything, the global emissions impact of adoption by 1% of the wealthiest means nothing globally if 99% have no access. Innovation with equitable access equals impact at scale.

Emissions reduction alone is not enough. Any corporate pledges that require offsets to reach net zero are critically dependent on actual changes in land use on the ground, most likely implemented by the rural poor. Key catalytic opportunities arise where any investment in equity overlaps with land use to incentivize changes in land use behavior, including land conservation, reforestation, afforestation, ecosystem restoration, forest wildfire resilience, and regenerative agriculture.


